Diversion/Deferred Prosecution Agreement

It is the policy of the Ozaukee County District Attorney's Office to offer offenders an opportunity to avoid having a conviction on their permanent criminal history by successfully participating in the Diversion or Deferred Prosecution Program.

The Diversion Program is offered to offenders before they are formally charged. If the offender successfully completes the program, the offender receives documentation signed by a prosecutor showing that the charge(s) have not and will not be filed.

The Deferred Prosecution Program (DPA) is offered to offenders after they have been formally charged with an offense. Once the offender has been arraigned, the prosecuting attorney offers the program through the defense attorney. If the defendant accepts and successfully completes the program, the charge(s) are permanently dismissed and the defendant receives documentation signed by both a prose-

Terms of both programs include, but are not limited to:

- Drug Screens and Portable Breathalyzer Tests (PBT)
- No further criminal arrests, citations or convictions during the program
- No association with people who have pending or past criminal charges
- No possession of dangerous weapons
- Notification of address changes and travel
- Additional laboratory testing, if deemed necessary
- Mental Health screening and treatment, if deemed necessary
- Substance abuse screening and treatment, if deemed necessary
- Reporting to the Diversion/ Deferred case manager as required
- Volunteer hours of community service for a non-profit organization
- Full restitution to victims, if applicable
- Payment of program fees

Mental Health

If you are to participate in Mental Health Treatment your case manager will work with you on making a referral.

A referral to Ozaukee County Human Services is used for those who are uninsured.

You will be required to abide by all recommendations made following your assessment.

Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse (AODA)

If you are to participate in AODA Treatment your case manager will work with you, through case contact, or make a referral.

A referral to Ozaukee County Human Services is used for those who are uninsured.

You will be required to abide by all recommendations made following your assessment.

Case Staffing

For a variety of reasons you may be required to report to a case staffing with TAD Program Staffing Team.

You will be given notice by your case manager of any need for your case to be staffed.
